- Legal Orders (courts/judges)
 - o Summer School: Virginia and Northland Learning Center offer summer school.
 - Require homework tutor/help.
 - o Community service at a school or other location. School administrator needs to facilitate.
 - o Withhold cellphone.
 - o Driver's license postponement or withdrawal.
 - Order UA immediately after court hearing.
 - Diagnostic Assessment or Rule 25 and follow recommendations for counseling, education, treatment, and after care.
